

A QUICK GUIDE TO A TEACHER/STUDENT CONVERSATION

First, introduce your mentor to an audience - and let them hear how you would describe their accomplishments and impact (*Trust me, it will get them in the mood to talk about themselves!*)

Then ask these shared questions:

- 1. Tell me about the first time you remember working together (you can tell your story too it's probably more interesting if you have different stories)
- 2. Tell me about a time we disagreed or when we challenged each other (again, ok to have different stories)

Next, get a little bit of your mentor's history and teaching practice:

- 3. How did you become inspired to become an educator?
- 4. Why do you love teaching the arts?
- 5. How do you know when your students have been successful?
- 6. What kind of art do you make when you get time for yourself?

Back to your relationship:

- 7. What do you remember about working with me? Did I frustrate you? Make you proud to be a teacher? Both? Neither?
- 8. What is one learning, piece of advice, idea that you got from me that you always take with you?
- 9. What advice do you have for up and comers?

And finally:

10. What questions do you have for me?
